<b>Who</b>	Teachers grades 5-12 (all subject areas) <i>Teacher teams – any combination of social studies, language arts, math, and science – are urged to attend.</i>
<b>What</b>	<i>Project Citizen</i> is an interdisciplinary curriculum for upper elementary, middle and high school students, designed to teach responsible participation in local and state government. Students work cooperatively to identify a public policy problem in their community, evaluate possible solutions, and develop an action plan for local government leaders to use in addressing the problem. The work culminates with a class portfolio and mock hearing.

<b>Why</b>	<i>Project Citizen</i> receives rave reviews from not only teachers, but also parents, administrators, and students. Research shows that students who participate in <i>Project Citizen</i> develop a greater understanding of the democratic process and a commitment to active citizenship.
